Ray,

There will be approximately 78 wind turbines in the project, as it states in our setback agreement. Originally, as MidAmerican said at an earlier meeting, the plan was to build the 78 turbines in two phases, but that both phases would be complete by the end of 2020, and the two phases would have 78 turbines combined. However, the plan is to now build all 78 turbines in one construction phase, starting in August 2019 and to be complete by the end of 2020.

We now have a better idea of where the turbines will go. Attached is a map showing 85 turbine locations. We will only build up to 78 of these locations, but having 7 alternate locations gives us options in case anything comes up with any of these locations that would prevent us from building it.

We also have no idea where this rumor of “confirmed” phase 2 for a different part of the county is coming from. The only turbines that MidAmerican and Invenergy are planning on for the county right now are included in the attached map. Perhaps a different company is looking at a project somewhere else in the County, but it’s not Invenergy or MidAmerican.
